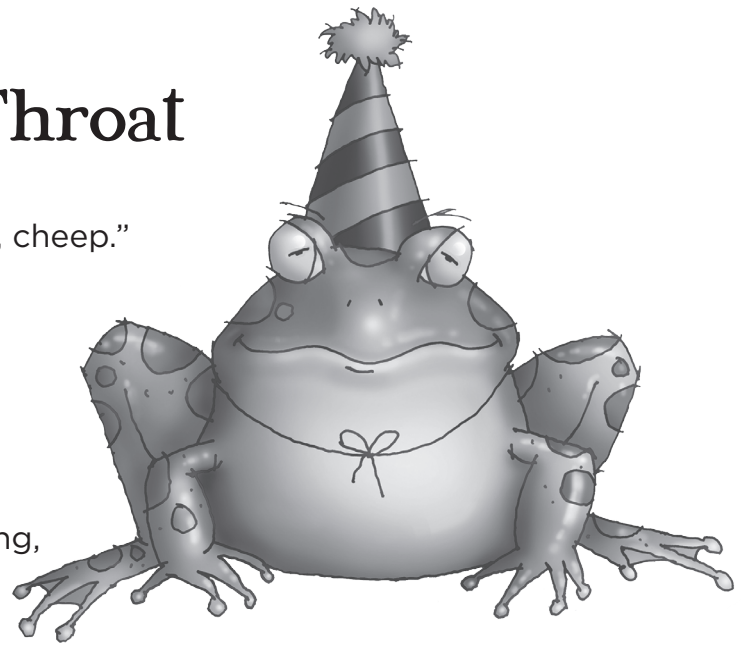


5. A Frog in Your Throat
